METSCELLANEOUS: New York's 16-9 start after 25 games is tied for the sixth-best start in franchise history with the 2016, 2015, 1999, 1976 and 1971 clubs...The 1986 Mets started 20-5 after 25 games...The 1988 and the 1972 Mets were 18-7 after 25 contests and the 2006 and the 1985 clubs were 17-8...New York's .640 winning percentage is the second-best in the National League, behind Arizona (.731, 19-7) and the fifth-best in the majors behind Boston (.731, 19-7), Yankees (.654, 17-9) and Houston (18-10, .643).

APRIL: New York has won 14 games in April (after posting two wins in March)...This is the Mets final game this month...The 14 April victories is tied for the ninth-most in franchise history...A win today would give the Mets their third-most wins in April (tied with the 2016, 2015, 2014, 2007, 2000 and 1988 clubs)...The club record is 16 wins in April by the 2002 and 2006 teams.

SERIES NOTES: The Mets won their first five series of the year but have dropped their last three series...New York is 2-2 in rubber games this year.

DAY GAMES: New York is 6-2 in day games this season...The pitching has posted a 2.15 ERA (18 earned runs/75.1 innings), the lowest ERA in the majors during day contests...The offense is batting .245 during the day.

COMEBACKS: New York has 10 come from behind victories this season, tied for the second-most in the majors with Boston...Philadelphia is first with 12 such wins.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 3-5 on this road trip (1-2 in Atlanta, 1-2 in St. Louis and 1-1 in San Diego) which concludes today...The Mets are 9-5 on the road this year, the fifth-best winning percentage (.643) in the majors.

YO!: Yoenis Céspedes is second in the NL and fifth in the majors with 25 RBI...Céspedes has seven go-ahead RBI this year, tied for the second-most in the majors...Jed Lowrie is first with eight...Céspedes has hit in five straight games, going 6-19 (.316) with two homers and seven RBI.

APRIL RBI: Céspedes has 21 this month...He is tied for the seventh-most RBI for April in team history...Jeff Kent is first with 26 April RBI...Céspedes' 21 RBI are tied for the third-most he's ever had in a calendar month (also: September, 2015)...He had 23 RBI in August, 2015 and April, 2016.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has reached base safely in all 19 games he's appeared in this season...It is the second-longest active streak in the majors and it is the longest streak of his career...Seven Mets (eight times) have started a season by reaching base safely in 20 or more straight games, last done by Carlos Beltran in 2009 when he reached in 25 consecutive games...John Olerud holds the franchise mark, reaching base safely in 30 consecutive games to begin the 1999 campaign.

BRANDON NIMMO: Has a .487 on-base percentage, the third-highest mark in the majors (min. 25 at-bats)...Nimmo is batting .286 (8-28) with a .571 slugging percentage.

METS-PADRES NOTES: The Mets have won one series (2011, 2-1) in San Diego since 2003.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is third in the National League and eighth in the majors with a .337 batting average, seventh in the NL with a .589 slugging percentage, is fifth in the NL with 14 extra-base hits and tied for sixth in the majors with nine doubles...Cabrera is hitting .366 (15-41) with five doubles, two homers and 10 RBI over his last 10 games...Hit his fifth homer of the year on Friday...Didn't reach five home runs until his 49th game last year (June 12)...Cabrera has hit in 12 of the 13 road games he's played this year, going 18-53 (.340) with four home runs and 11 RBI.

ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Returns again to San Diego, where he played for the Padres from 2006-2010, and was named to the NL All-Star team three times...González has hit .288 with 161 homers and 501 RBI in 800 games with San Diego...He has 64 homers and 230 RBI in 438 career games at Petco Park...Both totals are the most in the ballpark's history.

JAY BRUCE: Has hit in six straight games going, 9-26 (.346) with one double, one triple, one home run and four RBI during that stretch.

INTERESTING TO NOTE: The Mets had a streak of 57 straight games with a starting pitcher who had never played for another major league team snapped last night when Jason Vargas took to the mound...According to Elias, it was the fourth-longest streak of its kind in franchise history.

COMING HOME: The Mets will return home for a six-game homestand starting Tuesday, May 1 vs. Atlanta and Colorado...On Friday, May 4, every fan will receive a Jay Bruce t-shirt on Free Shirt Friday as the Mets take on the Rockies at 7:10 p.m....On Saturday, May 5, the first 25,000 fans will take home a Yoenis Céspedes Garden Gnome prior to the 7:10 p.m. game vs. Colorado...For tickets or information visit mets.com or call 718-507-TIXX.

ED CHARLES: Would have turned 85 today...Charles passed away on March 15 earlier this year...The Glider played with the Mets from 1967-1969 and had 32 doubles, 21 homers and 102 RBI during his career with the Mets...He scored the winning run in the ninth-inning in Game 2 of the World Series at Baltimore in a 2-1 win...Charles was the oldest member of the 1969 Miracle Mets at age 36.

MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Underwent Tommy John Surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery on March 24, 2015...Did not pitch in the majors in 2015 or 2016.
- » On the D.L. from June 20-July 1, 2017 (biceps tendinitis)
- » On the D.L. from July 24-end of 2017 season (stress reaction in right arm)

LAST TIME OUT: Received his first no-decision in his third start of the season, throwing 4.0 innings and giving up four runs, earned, on six hits while fanning three and walking two in the Mets' 6-5, extra-inning victory over St. Louis on April 24 at Busch Stadium.

VS. SAN DIEGO: Wheeler today is facing the Padres for the fourth time in his career, and first time since July 20, 2014...In that outing, Wheeler tossed 6.0 innings, allowing one run, earned, on eight hits while striking out seven and walking one in the Mets' 2-1 setback...Overall, in three-career starts against San Diego, Wheeler is 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (six earned runs/17.0 innings).

AT PETCO PARK: Wheeler will make his third-career start at Petco Park this afternoon...He is without a decision in his two previous outings in San Diego despite tossing a quality start each time out and owning a 1.50 ERA (two earned runs/12.0 innings) at the ballpark...Has whiffed 19 batters and walked only two in 12.0 innings pitched in San Diego...12 of the 19 punchouts came in his first start here on August 15, 2013, setting a career-high.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Wheeler today makes his third road start of the season... In his first two road starts, he is 1-0 with a 4.09 ERA (five earned runs/11.0 innings)... The Mets have won each of his two away starts in 2018...In 38 career road starts, Wheeler is 14-8 with a 3.16 ERA (77 earned runs/219.0 innings)...Has fanned 199 and walked 89 batters on the road...Last season, he was 1-2 with a 4.34 ERA (18 earned runs/37.1 innings) in seven road starts.

VS. NL WEST: In 13 career starts against NL West opponents, Wheeler is 4-5 with a 4.24 ERA (33 earned runs/70.0 innings) with 64 strikeouts and 27 walks...He has allowed exactly one earned run in six of those 13 outings but has also yielded four or more earned runs six times...Three of his last four starts against NL West clubs have been quality outings...The Mets are 1-8 in his last nine starts against the division since winning four of his first five career starts vs. NL West teams.

2017: In 2017, he made his second-career Opening Day roster after missing the entire 2015 and 2016 seasons while recovering from Tommy John surgery...Went 3-7 with a 5.21 ERA (50 earned runs/86.1 innings) in 17 starts...Went 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA (19 earned runs/58.2 innings) in 10 starts from April 12-June 7...Placed on the 10-Day D.L. on July 24, retroactive to July 23, with a stress reaction in his right arm and did not pitch the remainder of the season.

WHEELER'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Selected by the San Francisco Giants with the sixth overall pick in the first round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets, along with cash considerations, in exchange for outfielder Carlos Beltran on July 28, 2011.
- » Made his Major League debut on June 18, 2013 at Atlanta...Became the third pitcher in team history to earn a victory while throwing 6.0 or more shutout innings in his major league debut.
- » Led the Mets in starts (32) and strikeouts (187) in the 2014 season.
- » Threw a three-hit shutout in the Mets' 1-0 victory over the Marlins on June 19 at Marlins Park...Became the youngest Mets pitcher (24yr, 20d) to throw a 1-0 shutout since Dwight Gooden threw two of them in 1985 at age 20 years and 240 days old.
- » Was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on April 21, 2015 through the end of the season while recovering from Tommy John surgery...Missed the 2015 and 2016 seasons.
- » Returned to game action in 2017 after missing the 2015 and 2016 seasons recovering from Tommy John surgery...Made his second career Opening Day Roster...Allowed one run or fewer in six of his 17 starts.
- » His 2017 season ended when he was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on September 23 after two stints on the 10-Day Disabled List.

ATLANTA: Matz will face the Braves for the seventh time in his career on Monday...The Mets are 5-1 in his six-career starts against the Braves...Matz is 4-0 with a 2.97 ERA (12 earned runs/36.1 innings) in those outings with 27 strikeouts and five walks...Has allowed no more than two earned runs in five of his six career outings against the Braves...His four wins vs. the Braves represent a quarter of his career total and are twice as many as he has against any other team.
