ROSTER MOVES: The club recalled RHP Jacob Rhame from Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League and optioned RHP Corey Oswalt to Las Vegas...Rhame will wear #35 and will be available tonight at San Diego...In addition, the Mets claimed LHP Buddy Baumann off waivers from San Diego...Baumann will be optioned to Las Vegas (AAA)...In order to make room on the 40-man roster, David Wright was transferred to the 60-Day Disabled List...Rhame, 25, began the year with the Mets before he was optioned to the 51s on April 13...He recorded one save (April 8 at Washington) and posted a 7.36 ERA (three earned runs/3.2 innings) in four outings for New York this year.

METSCELLANEOUS: New York's 15-8 start after 23 games is tied for the fifth-best start in franchise history...The 1986 Mets started 19-4 after 23 games and the 2006, 1988 and 1972 Mets were 16-7...New York's .652 winning percentage is the second-best in the National League, behind Arizona (.707, 17-7) and the fourth-best in the majors behind Boston (.792, 19-5) and Houston (17-9, .654).

RECENT METS: The Mets have lost consecutive games for just the second time this year (also: April 16-17)...New York has lost seven of its last 11 games after starting the season 11-1...The Mets are 10-3 in games decided by two runs or less...New York has 10 come from behind victories this season, tied for the second-most in the majors with Boston.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 2-4 on this road trip (1-2 in Atlanta, 1-2 in St. Louis)...The Mets are 8-4 on the road this year, tied for the fourth-best winning percentage (.727) in the majors.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has reached base safely in all 18 games he's appeared in this season...It is tied for the third-longest active streak in the majors and it is the longest streak of his career...Conforto has a .403 on-base percentage, ranking 13th in the NL...He has 10 walks in his last 10 games.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is fifth in the National League with a .326 batting average, 13th in the NL with a .551 slugging percentage, is tied for eighth in the NL with 12 extra-base hits and tied for fifth in the majors with eight doubles...Cabrera is hitting .343 (12-35) with seven RBI over his last eight games...Cabrera has hit in 10 of the 11 road games he's played this year, going 15-47 (.319) with three home runs and eight RBI.

YO!: Yoenis Céspedes is second in the NL and tied for fifth in the majors with 23 RBI... Céspedes has seven go-ahead RBI this year, tied for the second-most in the majors...Jed Lowrie is first with eight...Céspedes is tied for 12th in the NL with five homers.

OFFENSE: The Mets have a .325 on-base percentage as a team, the 11th-best mark in the majors...The Mets have a .372 on-base percentage with runners in scoring position, the fifth-best mark in the majors...New York is fifth in the majors with 98 walks.

WILMER FLORES: Is a career .273 (112-411) hitter with 25 home runs vs. lefthanded pitching.

BRANDON NIMMO: Has a .500 on-base percentage, the highest mark in the majors (min. 25 at-bats)...Nimmo is batting .296 (8-27) with a .593 slugging percentage.

METS-PADRES NOTES: The Mets have won one series (2011, 2-1) in San Diego since 2003.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Returns again to San Diego, where he played for the Padres from 2006-2010, where he was named to the NL All-Star team three times...González hit .288 with 161 homers and 501 RBI in 799 games with San Diego...He has 64 homers and 230 RBI in 438 career games at Petco Park...Both totals are the most in the ballpark's history.

JACOB deGROM: Has recorded double-digit strikeouts in each of his last two outings (22 total strikeouts)...DeGrom has struck out 10 or more in three straight games once in his career (April 15-28, 2017)...He has struck out 10 or more batters 23 times in his career...The only other time deGrom has started a season 3-0 was in 2016...In his last two starts he's left the game in line for the win only to have the bullpen surrender the lead...According to Elias, since 2014, deGrom has 20 such "blown wins", the most in the majors.

deGROM VS. SD: Jacob deGrom is 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA (six earned runs/28.0 innings) in four career starts vs. the Padres...His 1.93 ERA is the second-lowest vs. any team (min. three starts)...He owns a 0.99 ERA vs. Colorado (five starts).

EXTRA EFFORT: Jacob deGrom has allowed only one extra-base hit to a righthanded batter this year (66 at-bats)...Anthony Rendon doubled on April 5.

PITCHING: The Mets are 10th in the majors with a 3.65 ERA, seventh with a .227 batting average against, sixth with a 1.19 WHIP and sixth with 239 strikeouts.

BULLPEN: New York's pen has nine wins, the most in the majors... The Mets pen has 10 saves, the second-most in the majors...The pen has held opponents to a .210 batting average, the eighth-lowest mark in the majors and ranks ninth in the majors with a 1.23 WHIP.

COMING HOME: Following this weekend series vs. the Padres, the Mets will return home for a six-game homestand starting Tuesday, May 1 vs. Atlanta and Colorado...On Friday, May 4, every fan will receive a Jay Bruce t-shirt on Free Shirt Friday as the Mets take on the Rockies at 7:10 p.m....On Saturday, May 5, the first 25,000 fans will take home a Yoenis Céspedes Garden Gnome prior to the 7:10 p.m. game vs. Colorado...For tickets or information visit mets.com or call 718-507-TIXX.

LAST START: Tossed 7.0 shutout innings on April 21 at Atlanta...Allowed four hits while striking out 10 and walking two...Took a no-decision in the Mets' 4-3 walk-off defeat... Was his second double-digit strikeout game of the season and the 23rd of his career... Allowed his first hit with two outs the fifth inning.

CAREER VS. SAN DIEGO: Is 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA (six earned runs/28.0 innings) in four career starts against the Padres, three of which have been quality starts...Last faced and defeated San Diego on July 24, 2017...Allowed two runs, earned, on five hits in 8.0 innings while recording eight strikeouts and walking two in the Mets' 5-3 victory at Petco Park...Was his only start against the Padres last season.

AT PETCO: DeGrom will make his fourth-career start at Petco Park tonight...In his three outings in San Diego, is 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA (five earned runs/21.0 innings)...Struck out 18 and walked three in those three starts.

LENGTHY: Has pitched at least 5.2 innings in eight-straight starts dating to September 10 of last season, the longest-active streak in the NL...Has thrown at least 7.0 innings in each of his last two starts, and 39 times overall since the start of the 2015 season, seventh-most in the NL.

HANG 10+: Tossed his second-straight double-digit strikeout game of the season on April 21 at Atlanta...Is one of just three major league pitchers to tally 10 or more punchouts in consecutive starts this season (also, Gerrit Cole, three, and Max Scherzer, two)...Since the start of the 2015 season, deGrom's 19 double-digit strikeout games are fourth-most in the NL...Became the fifth pitcher in franchise history to fan 10 or more in consecutive starts at least three times in his career (also, David Cone, Sid Fernandez, Dwight Gooden and Tom Seaver)...Ranks sixth in franchise history with 23-career double-digit strikeout games (Jerry Koosman is fifth with 24 such games).

VS. THE NL WEST: Is 10-5 with a 2.39 ERA (40 earned runs/150.1 innings) in 22 career starts against the NL West...His 2.39 ERA is second-best in the majors against NL West opponents since 2014, trailing only Clayton Kershaw (2.07 ERA vs. the NL West), and is the fifth-best mark all-time (min. 15 starts)...NL West opponents have combined to hit .184 (97-528) against deGrom in his career...That is the lowest average against vs. the NL West since the division was established in 1969 (min. 15 starts).

HOT START: Is 8-4 with a 2.59 ERA (32 earned runs/111.0 innings) in 18 career March/April starts...Since the start of the 2015, deGrom's 2.59 ERA in March/April and his 121 March/April strikeouts each rank sixth in the National League...Was 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (10 earned runs/31.2 innings) and an NL-best 44 strikeouts last April.

DURING deNIGHT: Took no-decisions in his first three night starts of the season...The Mets are 10-5 in his last 15 night starts and deGrom has thrown at least 6.0 innings 13 times in those 15 starts...Overall, he is 28-24 with a 3.52 ERA (177 earned runs/452.2 innings) in 72 career night starts...Went 13-5 with a 3.58 ERA (57 earned runs/143.1 innings) in 22 night starts in 2017.

ON deROAD: Is 1-0 with a 2.37 ERA (five earned runs/19 innings) in three road starts this season...Has struck out 21 and walked six away from Citi Field...Is 5-3 with a 2.53 ERA (19 earned runs/67.2 innings) in his last 10 road starts, beginning with his last start at Petco Park on July 24 of last season...His 117 road strikeouts in 2017 ranked fourth in the NL...Is 24-16 with a 3.54 ERA (142 earned runs/360.2 innings) in his career on the road.

SINCE THE START: In his first 112 career starts, deGrom has allowed one or no runs 48 times...That is the tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 112 career games...His 23 double-digit strikeout outings are the fourth-most in the NL since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 112 career games.

2017 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Went 15-10 with a 3.53 ERA (79 earned runs/201.1 innings)...Ranked in the top 10 in the National League in wins (15, t-sixth), strikeouts (239, second), WHIP (1.19, eighth), strikeouts per nine innings (10.68, third) and wins above replacement for pitchers (4.4, seventh, according to Baseball-Reference)...His 21 quality starts ranked third in the NL behind only Gio Gonzalez and Scherzer (22 each)... He was 13-3 in those 21 starts...Was the only pitcher to throw a 9.0-inning complete game for the Mets last season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JASON VARGAS (2017: 18-11, 4.16)

SPRING TRAINING/REHAB: Vargas will make his season debut tomorrow...Signed a two-year contract with the Mets on February 18...Made three Grapefruit League appearances before suffering a non-displaced fracture of the hamate bone in his right (non-throwing) hand...Underwent surgery on March 20 at the Hospital for Special Surgery...Had a 4.15 ERA (four earned runs/8.2 innings) in Grapefruit League play...Pitched 4.0 innings, allowing three runs, earned, on three hits with four strikeouts in a rehab start with Triple-A Las Vegas on April 23.

2017 SEASON: Went 18-11 with a 4.16 ERA (83 earned runs/179.2 innings) with Kansas City...Won seven-straight starts from May 27-June 30...Led the American League with a 2.62 ERA and 12 wins at the All-Star Break last season.
