**METSCELLANEOUS:** New York's 15-7 start after 22 games is tied for the third-best start in franchise history with the 2016, 2015, 2006 and 1972 clubs...The 1986 Mets started 18-4 after 22 games and the 1988 Mets were 16-6...New York's .682 winning percentage is the second-best in the National League, behind Arizona (.696, 16-7) and the third-best in the majors behind Boston (.783, 18-5).

**ON THE ROAD:** The Mets are 2-3 on this road trip (1-2 in Atlanta, 1-1 in St. Louis)...This road trip concludes in San Diego...The Mets are 8-3 on the road this year, tied for the second-best winning percentage (.727) in the majors with Milwaukee...Los Angeles-AL is first (11-2, .846).

**SEE YA NEXT YEAR:** Today marks the final meeting between the Mets and Cardinals this year...New York took two of three from St. Louis at Citi Field, March 29-April 1...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, excluding strike-shortened seasons, the only time the Mets played their last game of a season against a particular NL team before May 1 was in 2001 vs. the Reds (April 13-15 at Shea Stadium and April 20-22 at Cincinnati).

**RUBBER GAMES:** The Mets are 2-1 in rubber games this year, including 1-0 vs. St. Louis.

**COMEBACK:** New York has 10 come from behind victories this season, the second-most in the majors...The Phillies are first with 11...The Mets did not record their 10th comeback victory last season until May 29, in their 49th game, and in no other season in team history did they have 10 such wins before May...Research courtesy of Elias.

**TRAILING AFTER 7:** The Mets are 4-5 this season when trailing after seven innings...New York went 4-72 last year when behind after seven innings.

**BRUCE VS. THE BIRDS:** Jay Bruce has hit 23 career home runs and driven in 75 runs vs. St. Louis during his career...The 23 home runs are tied for the second-most vs. any team (also Pittsburgh)...He has 35 home runs vs. Milwaukee...Bruce's 75 RBI are the second-most vs. any club...He has 88 RBI vs. Milwaukee.

**MICHAEL CONFORTO:** Has reached base safely in all 17 games he's appeared in this season...It is tied for the third-longest active streak in the majors and the longest of his career, also April 10-30, 2016...Conforto has a .394 on-base percentage...He has 10 walks in his last nine games.

**ASDRÚBAL CABRERA:** Leads the National League and is fourth in the majors with a .349 batting average, seventh in the NL with a .590 slugging percentage, is tied for fifth in the NL with 12 extra-base hits and tied for third in the majors with eight doubles...Cabrera is hitting .414 (12-29) with seven RBI over his last seven games...Cabrera has hit in every road game he's played this year, going 15-41 (.366) with three home runs and eight RBI over 10 games.

**YO!** Yoenis Céspedes is second in the NL and sixth in the majors with 21 RBI...Céspedes is tied for 12th in the NL with five homers.

**METS-CARDINALS NOTES:** The Mets are 10-20 in St. Louis since 2009.

**HONORING RUSTY STAUB:** Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



**REMATCH:** Noah Syndergaard and Carlos Martínez faced each other on Opening Day, March 29 at Citi Field...The Mets won, 9-4 as Syndergaard earned the win...He worked 6.0 innings, allowed four runs and struck out 10.

**NOAH SYNDERGAARD:** The Mets are 13-3 in their last 16 games when Noah Syndergaard starts following a team loss...In those 16 starts, Syndergaard is 7-3 with a 2.43 ERA (27 earned runs/100.0 innings) with 122 strikeouts.

**SYNDER-STATS:** The Mets are 5-0 in Syndergaard's starts this year...He ranks sixth in the NL with 39 strikeouts...Syndergaard has a 2.01 career ERA (23 earned runs/103.0 innings) in 16 starts vs. the NL Central...That is the lowest ERA against the division since its inception in 1994 (min. 15 starts)...He has held his opponent to two or fewer earned runs in 13 of his 16 starts against the division.

**DAY BASEBALL:** New York is 6-1 in day games this season...The pitching has posted a 2.14 ERA (15 earned runs/63.0 innings) and the offense is batting .256 during the day.

**BULLPEN:** New York's pen has nine wins, the most in the majors...The Mets pen has 10 saves, tied for the most in the majors and are tied for fifth in the majors with 18 holds...New York relievers have pitched 83.1 innings, tied for the 13th-fewest in the majors.

**COREY OSWALT:** Made his major league debut last night and tossed 4.2 innings in relief...He set a club record for most innings thrown in relief by a Mets reliever in his major league debut...Kevin Tapani held the previous mark with 4.1 innings on July 4, 1989 at Houston.

**JEURYS FAMILIA:** Is tied for second in the majors with nine saves...Familia has allowed two runs in 13.0 innings (1.38 ERA) this year.

**OFFENSE:** The Mets have a .329 on-base percentage as a team, the 10th-best mark in the majors...The Mets have a .380 on-base percentage with runners in scoring position, the fifth-best mark in the majors.

**WALKS:** New York is tied for fifth in the majors with 96 walks...In five games vs. St. Louis this season, the Mets have drawn 26 walks.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched a quality start and took a no-decision at SunTrust Park in the Mets' 5-3 extra-inning triumph over Atlanta on April 20...Threw 6.0 innings, allowing three runs, earned, on seven hits with six punchouts...Did not walk a batter for the second time this season...The Mets improved to 5-0 in his starts in the 2018 campaign.

**VS. ST. LOUIS:** Syndergaard will make his second start of the season vs. the Cardinals this afternoon...Defeated St. Louis on Opening Day while recording his 12th-career double-digit strikeout game...Has pitched at least 6.0 innings in each of his three outings vs. the Redbirds and is 1-2 in his career vs. the club...Owns a 3.79 career ERA (eight earned runs/19.0 innings) with 24 punchouts and four walks vs. the Cards.

**GRAND CENTRAL:** Syndergaard owns a 2.01 career ERA (23 earned runs/103.0 innings) in 16 starts vs. the NL Central...That is the lowest ERA against the division since its inception in 1994 (min. 15 starts)...Has held his opponent to two or fewer earned runs in 13 of his 16 starts against the division (allowed one or no earned runs nine times)...Has five double-digit strikeout games against NL Central squads, including two this year.

**HE'S AN AVENGER:** The Mets are 13-3 in their last 16 games when Syndergaard starts following a team loss, including a perfect 5-0 mark in his last five starts after a loss...In those 16 starts, Syndergaard is 7-3 with a 2.43 ERA (27 earned runs/100.0 innings) and 122 strikeouts.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Mets have gone 16-6 Syndergaard's last 22 away starts since starting 1-8 in his first nine career road starts...In those 22 starts, he is 11-4 with a 2.62 ERA (37 earned runs/127.1 innings) and 148 strikeouts...Has allowed one or no earned runs in seven of his previous nine road starts and has surrendered more than two earned runs only four times in his last 22 starts on the road...In all, he is 11-9 in 31 career road starts with a 3.26 ERA (63 earned runs/173.2 innings).

**APRIL SHOWERS GIVE THOR POWERS:** Today is Syndergaard's 14th-career April start...Has a 2.51 ERA (21 earned runs/75.1 innings) with 99 strikeouts in his 13 April outings...Since 2016, his 2.51 ERA in April is fifth-lowest among all qualifying NL pitchers...His 32.2% strikeout rate in April is the highest in the majors since 2016 and the best of any month in his career...His 3.6% walk rate in April since 2016 is the third-lowest among all pitchers in that span...Has allowed only one homer in 75.1 April innings pitched (0.12 HR/9).

**IN GOOD COMPANY...:** Among active pitchers with at least 60 career starts, Syndergaard's 2.92 ERA (127 earned runs/391.1 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw and his 2.37 career ERA...Syndergaard is one of only five active major league hurlers with at least 60 career starts to sport a sub-3.00 ERA...Syndergaard ranks third in the NL in strikeout-to-walk ratio since 2015 (5.57 SO/BB), topped only by Kershaw (7.79) and Max Scherzer (5.75).

**...AND ALL BY HIMSELF:** Syndergaard leads the Mets and ranks fifth in the NL with a 7.8 SO/BB ratio this season (39 strikeouts/five walks)...He is the only pitcher in major league history to record a strikeout-to-walk ratio of at least 5.0 in each of his first three major league seasons...Posted a 5.4 SO/BB ratio in his rookie campaign, a 5.1 mark in 2016 and fanned 11.3 batters per walk issued last season.

**RAGNAROKSTAR:** Excluding his two starts at the tail end of last season as he recovered from a lat injury (2.0 IP vs. Washington on September 23 and 1.0 IP at Philadelphia on October 1), Syndergaard has pitched at least 5.0 innings in 55 of his 64 remaining starts...40 of those 64 starts have been quality outings...Has pitched at least 6.0 innings 45 times and at least 7.0 innings 24 times.

**SENS8TIONAL:** Syndergaard punched out eight-consecutive batters from the second through the fourth inning in his last start, April 15 vs. Milwaukee...That is tied with Jacob deGrom's streak on September 15, 2014 vs. Miami for the second-longest strikeout streak in franchise history (Tom Seaver holds the franchise and MLB record with 10 consecutive strikeouts on April 22, 1970 vs. San Diego).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (2-0, 2.53)

**PREVIOUS START:** Was left with a tough-luck no-decision after spinning 7.0-shutout innings, April 21 at Atlanta...Recorded his second-straight start with at least 10 strikeouts, fanning 10 Braves hitters in the Mets' 4-3 walk-off setback...Allowed a season-low-tying four hits and walked two batters.

**IN deDOUBLE DIGITS:** With back-to-back double-digit strikeout efforts in his last two starts, deGrom is one of only three pitchers this season to record consecutive 10+ strikeout games (also, Gerrit Cole, three, and Max Scherzer, two)...He ranks fifth in the NL with 40 punchouts this season.

- Hit in 11 straight games from March 31-April 14...Batted .378 (17-45) with four doubles, three homers, five RBI and 11 runs scored in those 11 games...Was his longest hitting streak since hitting safely in 11 straight from September 4-17, 2017.
- Recorded his seventh career multi-homer game (fourth as a Met) and his first since June 12, 2017 vs. Chicago-NL with his multi-homer game last night in Miami...Homered on both sides of the plate for the second time in his career (both instances have come as a Met)...Was also the last Met to homer from both sides of the plate (August 26, 2016 vs. Philadelphia)...Overall, it was the 22nd time a Met has homered from both sides of the plate.

- Has 18 home runs in March/April since 2016 (his first March/April with the Mets)...The 18 homers are tied for ninth-most in the majors in March/April since 2016.
- Has 35 home runs in March/April games, most of any month in his career (has 30 homers in 143 career August games).
- Clubbed his sixth career grand slam on April 18 vs. Washington...Five of his six grand slams have come as a Met...The five slams are tied for second-most in Mets history with Robin Ventura, Kevin McReynolds, Carlos Beltrán, Howard Johnson and John Milner...Mike Piazza has the most with six.
- Céspedes six grand slams since the start of 2015 are tied for most in the majors in that time (also Manny Machado).
- In 55 at-bats with the bases loaded in his career, Céspedes is hitting .455 (25-55) with six doubles, six homers, 71 RBI and 63 runs scored...The .455 average is second-best among active players with at least 60 plate appearances with the bases loaded...Josh Donaldson is hitting .468.
- Has two outfield assists this season...His 65 outfield assists since 2012 (his first season) are tops in the majors.
