MEMORIAL MASS FOR RUSTY STAUB: A Memorial Mass for Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub will take place at St. Patrick's Cathedral tomorrow at 2 p.m...A six-time All-Star and Mets Ambassador, Staub, 73, passed away on March 29...Members of the NYPD, FDNY and PAPD Ceremonial units and respective pipe bands will be participating...Cardinal Timothy Michael Dolan, Archbishop of New York, will be the main celebrant...Monsignor Kevin Sullivan, Executive Director of Catholic Charities, will preach.

METSCELLANEOUS: New York's 14-6 start after 20 games is tied for the third-best start in franchise history with the 1988 and 1972 clubs...The 1986 Mets started 16-4 and the 2015 Mets were 15-5 after 20 games...New York's .700 winning percentage is the second-best in the National League, behind Arizona (.714, 15-6) and the third-best in the majors behind Boston (.810, 17-4).

RESCHEDULED: The Mets were rained out on Sunday in Atlanta... That game will be made up as part of a day-night doubleheader on Memorial Day, May 28...The first game will start at 1:10 p.m. and the second game will begin at 7:10 p.m.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets went 1-2 in Atlanta...This road trip continues in St. Louis and concludes in San Diego...The Mets are 7-2 on the road this year, the second-best winning percentage (.778) in the majors behind Los Angeles-AL (10-1, .909).

SEE YA NEXT YEAR: This series marks the final meeting between the Mets and Cardinals this year...New York took two of three from St. Louis at Citi Field, March 29-April 1...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, excluding strike-shortened seasons, the only time the Mets played their last game of a season against a particular NL team before May 1 was in 2001 vs. the Reds (April 13-15 at Shea Stadium and April 20-22 at Cincinnati).

COMEBACK: New York has nine come from behind victories this season, the second-most in the majors, one behind the Philadelphia (10).

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Ranks fourth in the majors with a .354 batting average, eighth in the NL with a .608 slugging percentage, is tied for fourth in the NL with 12 extra-base hits and tied for second in the majors with eight doubles...He has driven in a run in three straight games (four total).

CABBY NOTES: Asdrúbal Cabrera is hitting .440 (11-25) with seven RBI over his last six games...Cabrera has hit in every road game this year, going 14-37 (.378) with three home runs and eight RBI over nine games.

OFFENSE: The Mets have a .333 on-base percentage as a team, the eighth-best mark in the majors...The Mets have a .385 on-base percentage with runners in scoring position, the fourth-best mark in the majors.

RBI: Yoenis Céspedes has six go-ahead RBI this year tied with teammate Todd Frazier and others for the fifth-most in the majors...The Mets are the only team in baseball with two players with six or more go-ahead RBI this year...Céspedes is tied for fourth in the National League with 18 RBI.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



PITCHING: New York's staff has posted a 3.61 ERA, the 11th-lowest mark in the majors...The team has a 1.19 WHIP, the ninth-lowest mark in the majors and has held opponents to a .225 average, the seventh-lowest in the majors...The Mets rank seventh in the majors with 212 strikeouts.

BULLPEN: New York's pen has eight wins, tied for the most in the majors with the Phillies...The Mets pen has nine saves, tied for the most in the majors with the Rockies, and are tied for second in the majors with 18 holds...New York relievers have pitched 72.2 innings, the 10th-fewest in the majors...Of the top 50 relievers in terms of innings pitched, the Mets only have three pitchers in the top-50 (Gsellman, 12.1 IP, tied for 23rd, Familia, 12.0 IP tied for 26th and Lugo, 11.0 IP tied for the 46th-most).

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has reached base safely in all 15 games he's appeared in this season...It is tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the majors...Conforto has a .387 on-base percentage... He has drawn a walk in seven straight games, the longest active streak in the majors.

HOT TODDY: Todd Frazier has a .400 on-base percentage... Frazier has nine RBI in his last 10 games...Overall, Frazier is tied for 15th in the NL with 14 RBI...He is 6-19 (.316) with 11 RBI with runners in scoring position this season...He is tied for sixth in the NL with 16 walks.

BRUCE VS. THE BIRDS: Jay Bruce has hit 22 career home runs and driven in 72 runs vs. St. Louis during his career...Those totals are the third-most for Bruce vs. any team...He has 35 homers and 88 RBI vs. Milwaukee and 23 home runs and 74 RBI vs. Pittsburgh.

INTERESTING TO NOTE: The Mets have not allowed an opposing pitcher to reach base safely (via hit, walk or hit batsman) in 41 plate appearances this season.

JASON VARGAS: Started last night for Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League vs. El Paso...He went 4.0 innings, allowed three hits, three runs, earned, issued two walks and struck out four...Vargas threw 66 pitches, 42 strikes...He has been on the Disabled List since the start of the season with non-displaced fracture of hamate in right hand.

MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Underwent Tommy John Surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery on March 24, 2015...Did not pitch in the majors in 2015 or 2016.
- » On the DL from June 20-July 1, 2017 (biceps tendinitis)
- » On the DL from July 24-end of 2017 season (stress reaction in right arm)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss despite throwing a quality start, his second in two starts this season, in the Mets' 5-2 setback vs. the Nationals on April 17 at Citi Field...Pitched 6.0 innings and gave up three runs, earned, on seven hits... Notched his first-career multi-hit game, collecting singles in back-to-back plate appearances in the third and fifth innings.

VS. ST. LOUIS: Faced St. Louis twice last season in back-to-back starts sandwiched around the All-Star Break...In those two starts, his only career starts against the Cardinals, Wheeler went 0-2 with a 4.76 ERA (six earned runs/11.1 innings)...His last outing against the Cardinals came on July 17, 2017 at Citi Field when Wheeler threw 5.1 innings, allowing four runs, earned, while striking out five and walking four in a 6-3 Mets loss.

AT THE PLATE: Had a career-high two hits in his last game...Singled to right field off Gio Gonzalez to lead off the bottom of the third...Singled again off Gonzalez to start off the fifth inning...Snapped an 0-20 skid that spanned 12 games from May 9, 2017-April 11 of this season...Before his last start, Wheeler last notched a hit on April 29, 2017 at Nationals Park off Stephen Strasburg.

ON THE ROAD: In 37 career road starts, Wheeler is 14-8 with a 3.06 ERA (73 earned runs/215.0 innings)...Has fanned 196 and walked 87 batters on the road... Last season, he was 1-2 with a 4.34 ERA (18 earned runs/37.1 innings) in seven road starts...Won his most recent and only road start this season on April 11 at Miami.

VS. NL CENTRAL: In 10 career starts against NL Central opponents, Wheeler is 3-4 with a 3.83 ERA (24 earned runs/56.1 innings)...Wheeler has allowed no more than two earned runs in seven of those 10 starts...Seven of the 10 have also been quality starts...Has lost his last four starts against NL Central clubs after beginning his career with three-straight wins against the division.

2017 SEASON: Made his second-career Opening Day roster after missing the entire 2015 and 2016 seasons while recovering from Tommy John surgery...Went 3-7 with a 5.21 ERA (50 earned runs/86.1 innings) in 17 starts...Went 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA (19 earned runs/58.2 innings) in 10 starts from April 12-June 7...Placed on the 10-Day DL on June 21, retroactive to June 20, with biceps tendinitis...Activated from the DL on July 1...Placed on the 10-Day DL on July 24, retroactive to July 23, with a stress reaction in his right arm and did not pitch the remainder of the season.

WHEELER'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Selected by the San Francisco Giants with the sixth overall pick in the first round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets, along with cash considerations, in exchange for outfielder Carlos Beltran on July 28, 2011.
- » Made his Major League debut on June 18, 2013 at Atlanta...Became the third pitcher in team history to earn a victory while throwing 6.0 or more shutout innings in his major league debut.
- » Led the Mets in starts (32) and strikeouts (187) in the 2014 season.
- » Threw a three-hit shutout in the Mets' 1-0 victory over the Marlins on June 19 at Marlins Park...Became the youngest Mets pitcher (24yr, 20d) to throw a 1-0 shutout since Dwight Gooden threw two of them in 1985 at age 20 years and 240 days old.
- » Was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on April 21, 2015 through the end of the season while recovering from Tommy John surgery...Missed the 2015 and 2016 seasons.
- » Returned to game action after missing the 2015 and 2016 seasons recovering from Tommy John surgery...Made his second career Opening Day Roster...Allowed one run or fewer in six of his 17 starts.
- » His 2017 season ended when he was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on September 23 after two stints on the 10-Day Disabled List.

LAST START: Matz took a no decision in the Mets' 11-5 victory over the Nationals at Citi Field on April 18...Pitched 4.0 innings and allowed three runs, earned, on three hits (surrendered a three-run homer in the first inning)...Retired the final 10 batters he faced...Struck out six and walked a season-low one batter.

VS. ST. LOUIS: Matz will face the Redbirds for the second time this season on Tuesday...Also faced St. Louis on April 1 at Citi Field...Suffered the Mets' first loss of the season, giving up three runs, earned on four hits (two home runs) over 4.0 innings...In two career starts against the Cardinals, Matz is 0-2 with a 8.64 ERA (eight earned runs/8.1 innings) with five strikeouts and four walks.

- Dating to August 25 of last season, Cabrera is batting .361 (69-191) with 20 doubles, nine home runs, 36 RBI and 32 runs scored (54 games).
- Hit in 11 straight games from March 31-April 14...Batted .378 (17-45) with four doubles, three homers, five RBI and 11 runs scored in those 11 games...Was his longest hitting streak since getting safely in 11 straight from September 4-17, 2017.

- Has reached base safely in all 15 games he's played in thus far and owns a .387 OBP...The 15-game on-base streak is tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the majors and is tied for the second-longest of his career...The on-base streak is his longest since his career-best 17-game streak from April 10-30, 2016...Has drawn at least one walk in seven consecutive games entering play today, the longest active streak in the majors.
- Hit .368 (7-19) with two doubles, one homer, one RBI, three walks and two runs scored in five games vs. St. Louis in 2017.
