ROSTER MOVE: Prior to today's game, the Mets will recall LHP Jason Vargas from his rehabilitation assignment and reinstate him from the 10-Day Disabled List...Vargas will wear #40...He was placed on the Disabled List on Opening Day after suffering a non-displaced fracture of hamate in right (glove) hand on March 16 in a minor league spring training game and underwent surgery on March 20...He made one rehab start on April 23 for Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League vs. El Paso, working 4.0 innings (66 pitches, 42 strikes), allowing three hits, three runs and striking out four...Vargas signed a two-year with the Mets on February 18 earlier this year...Vargas, 35, was tied for the American League lead in wins (18) and was named to his first All-Star team last year with Kansas City...He went 18-11 with a 4.16 ERA (83 earned runs/179.2 innings) in 32 starts with the Royals...Vargas averaged 190.0 innings per season from 2010-2014... He also has five seasons of 30 or more starts since 2010...A corresponding roster move will be made prior to the game.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: Jason Vargas made two starts for the Mets in 2007, his last coming on July 3 at Colorado...According to Elias, Vargas will become the fifth Mets who has gone 10 or more years between appearances with the club, joining: RHP Jason Isringhausen, RHP Bob L. Miller, catcher Kelly Stinnett and RHP David Cone.

METSCELLANEOUS: New York's 16-8 start after 24 games is tied for the fourth-best start in franchise history with the 2015, 2006 and 1985 clubs...The 1986 Mets started 20-4 after 24 games and 1988 and 1972 Mets were 17-7...New York's .652 winning percentage is the second-best in the National League, behind Arizona (.707, 17-7) and the fourth-best in the majors behind Boston (.792, 19-5) and Houston (17-9, .654).

COMEBACKS: New York has 10 come from behind victories this season, tied for the second-most in the majors with Boston... Philadelphia is first with 12 such wins.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 3-4 on this road trip (1-2 in Atlanta, 1-2 in St. Louis and 1-0 in San Diego)...The Mets are 9-4 on the road this year, tied for the fourth-best winning percentage (.692) in the majors.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has reached base safely in all 19 games he's appeared in this season...It is tied for the second-longest active streak in the majors and it is the longest streak of his career...Seven Mets (eight times) have started a season by reaching base safely in 20 or more straight games, last done by Carlos Beltran in 2009 when he reached in 25 consecutive games...John Olerud holds the franchise mark, reaching base safely in 30 consecutive games to begin the 1999 campaign.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Hit his fifth homer of the year last night...Didn't reach five home runs until his 49th game last year (June 12)...Cabrera is tied for fourth in the National League with a .333 batting average, eighth in the NL with a .591 slugging percentage, is fifth in the NL with 14 extra-base hits and tied for fifth in the majors with nine doubles...Cabrera is hitting .359 (14-39) with five doubles, two homers and 10 RBI over his last nine games...Cabrera has hit in 11 of the 12 road games he's played this year, going 17-51 (.333) with four home runs and 11 RBI.

METS-PADRES NOTES: The Mets have won one series (2011, 2-1) in San Diego since 2003.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Returns again to San Diego, where he played for the Padres from 2006-2010, and was named to the NL All-Star team three times...González has hit .288 with 161 homers and 501 RBI in 800 games with San Diego...He has 64 homers and 230 RBI in 438 career games at Petco Park...Both totals are the most in the ballpark's history.

YO!: Yoenis Céspedes is second in the NL and tied for fifth in the majors with 23 RBI...Céspedes has seven go-ahead RBI this year, tied for the second-most in the majors...Jed Lowrie is first with eight.

WILMER FLORES: Is a career .271 (112-414) hitter with 25 home runs vs. lefthanded pitching.

BRANDON NIMMO: Has a .500 on-base percentage, tied for the highest mark in the majors (min. 25 at-bats)...Nimmo is batting .296 (8-27) with a .593 slugging percentage.

JUAN LARAGES: Is batting .371 (13-35), the fourth-highest mark in the majors (min. 40 PA)...Lagares is hitting .333 (5-15) vs. lefthanders this season.

PITCHING: The Mets are eighth in the majors with a 3.54 ERA, seventh with a .226 batting average against, sixth with a 1.19 WHIP and sixth with 247 strikeouts.

deNOTES: Jacob deGrom has now made 113 career starts and allowed one run or fewer 49 times (43 percent)...DeGrom currently has a 14.1 scoreless inning streak dating to April 21, the third-longest active streak in the majors...He has 48 strikeouts, tied for the third-most in the majors.

IN THE MINORS: RHP Ryder Ryan has tossed 12.0 scoreless innings with 16 strikeouts for St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League this year...Ryan was acquired from Cleveland in exchange for Jay Bruce on August 9, 2017...He has hurled 23.0 scoreless innings with 27 strikeouts since August 18, 2017.

COMING HOME: The Mets will return home for a six-game homestand starting Tuesday, May 1 vs. Atlanta and Colorado...On Friday, May 4, every fan will receive a Jay Bruce t-shirt on Free Shirt Friday as the Mets take on the Rockies at 7:10 p.m....On Saturday, May 5, the first 25,000 fans will take home a Yoenis Céspedes Garden Gnome prior to the 7:10 p.m. game vs. Colorado...For tickets or information visit mets.com or call 718-507-TIXX.

SPRING TRAINING/REHAB: Vargas will make his 2018 season debut today... Signed a two-year contract with the Mets on February 18...Made three Grapefruit League appearances before suffering a non-displaced fracture of the hamate bone in his right (non-throwing) hand...Underwent surgery on March 20 at the Hospital for Special Surgery...Had a 4.15 ERA (four earned runs/8.2 innings) in Grapefruit League play...Pitched 4.0 innings, allowing three runs, earned, on three hits with four strikeouts in a rehab start with Triple-A Las Vegas on April 23.

BACK IN THE NEW YORK GROOVE: With this evening's start, Vargas will be making his third career start with the Mets and first since July 3, 2007 at Colorado, 10 years, nine months and 26 days ago...Will be the fifth Mets player to go at least 10 years between appearances, joining RHP Jason Istringhausen, RHP Bob L. Miller, catcher Kelly Stinnett and RHP David Cone.

VS. SAN DIEGO: Vargas will make his first start against the Friars since 2011...In all, has started four games against the Padres in his career and is 2-1 in those four starts with a 2.39 ERA (seven earned runs/26.1 innings)...His last start against San Diego came on July 1, 2011 with the Seattle Mariners...Vargas pitched a complete game shutout, scattering six hits and fanning seven batters in the M's 6-0 victory at Safeco Field.

2017 SEASON: Went 18-11 with a 4.16 ERA (83 earned runs/179.2 innings) in 32 starts for Kansas City...Was named to his first-career All-Star team...His 18 wins were a career-high and tied for the major league lead with Clayton Kershaw, Carlos Carrasco and Corey Kluber...His 32 starts were his most in a season since starting 33 games for the 2012 Mariners...Tossed 179.2 innings after injuries limited the southpaw to 55.0 innings total from 2015-16.

ALL-STAR-WORTHY FIRST HALF: At the All-Star Break last season, Vargas led the American League in both wins (12) and ERA (2.62), while ranking among the league leaders in WHIP (1.15, 11th) and walks per nine innings (2.12, eighth)...Held opponents to a .179 average (12-for-67) with runners in scoring position over his first 16 starts...Won seven consecutive starts from May 27-June 30, 2017...Pitched a complete game shutout on June 2 vs. Cleveland, his 12th career complete game and seventh shutout...Was the first pitcher in the majors to reach 10 wins, doing so in his 14th start on June 18...Posted a sub-2.00 ERA in both April and June...Was 6-0 with a 1.98 ERA (nine earned runs/41.0 innings) in his six June starts with 23 strikeouts and nine walks.

APRIL: Vargas was 3-1 with a 1.40 ERA (four earned runs/25.2 innings) in four April starts last season...Allowed one or no earned runs in each of his first three starts of 2017...His 1.40 April ERA ranked fifth in the American League last season...Is 14-11 in 39 career April starts with a 4.02 ERA (103 earned runs/230.2 innings).

VARGAS' CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Vargas was selected by the Florida Marlins in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets on November 20, 2006...Started two games for the Mets in 2007.
- » Acquired by Seattle on December 10, 2008 as part of a three-team, 12-player trade.
- » From 2010-12, was one of eight lefthanded pitchers to log 192.0 innings or more each year...During that time, his 168 walks were third-fewest among MLB lefties behind only mark Buehrle (134) and Cole Hamels (157).
- » Acquired by Los Angeles-AL on December 19, 2012 in exchange for Kendrys Morales.
- » Named AL Pitcher of the Month in May, 2013, going 5-0 with a 2.30 ERA (11 earned runs/43.0 innings).
- » Signed to a four-year contract by the Kansas City Royals on November 22, 2013.
- » Selected to his first All-Star team in 2017...Worked a scoreless fourth inning in Miami.
- » Tied Clayton Kershaw, Carlos Carrasco and Corey Kluber for the major-league lead with a career-best 18 wins in 2017.
- » Signed by the New York Mets to a two-year contract with a team option for a third year on February 18, 2018.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK WHEELER (1-1, 4.24)

LAST TIME OUT: Received his first no-decision of the season in the Mets' 6-5, extra-inning victory over the Cardinals on April 24 at Busch Stadium...Pitched 4.0 innings and allowed four runs, earned, on six hits...Fanned three batters and walked two.

VS. SAN DIEGO: In his three career starts against the Padres, Wheeler is 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (six earned runs/17.0 innings) with 23 punchouts and five walks...Wheeler owns a 1.50 ERA (two earned runs/12.0 innings) in two career starts at Petco Park in San Diego...Fanned a career high 12 batters in San Diego on August 15, 2013.

- Céspedes' 23 RBI are tied for second-most by a Met in March/April...Only Jeff Kent (26 RBI in March/April 1994) and John Buck (25) had more in the month.

- Clubbed his sixth career grand slam on April 18 vs. Washington...Five of his six grand slams have come as a Met...The five slams are tied for second-most in Mets history with Robin Ventura, Kevin McReynolds, Carlos Beltrán, Howard Johnson and John Milner...Mike Piazza has the most with six.
- Céspedes six grand slams since the start of 2015 are tied for most in the majors in that time (also Manny Machado).
- In 55 at-bats with the bases loaded in his career, Céspedes is hitting .455 (25-55) with six doubles, six homers, 71 RBI and 63 runs scored...The .455 average is second-best among active players with at least 60 plate appearances with the bases loaded...Josh Donaldson is hitting .468.

- Has reached base safely in all 19 games he's played in thus far and owns a .395 OBP...The 19-game on-base streak is tied for the second-longest active streak in the majors and is also the longest of his career...The 19-game on-base streak to begin a season is tied for the ninth-longest in Mets history...Seven Mets (eight times) have reached base in at least 20 consecutive games to begin the season...Carlos Beltrán was the last to do it when he reached in his first 25 games of 2009...John Olerud holds the franchise record after reaching base in 30 consecutive games to open the 1999 campaign.
- Activated off the 10-Day DL on April 5...Homered in third at bat...Since the start of last season, Conforto has 28 home runs, second-most by a Met in that time behind Jay Bruce's 31 homers with the Mets in that time frame.
- Selected to his first NL All-Star team in 2017...Set career-highs in home runs (27), RBI (68), OPS (.939), hits (104), walks (57) and runs scored (72) in 2017 while playing in 109 games...At the time of his season-ending injury, Conforto ranked among NL league leaders in OPS (.944, ninth), OBP (.386, 12th) and slugging percentage (.558, ninth).
